## White Tail Branch Road – Lot 10 Access

Without limiting the foregoing, we offer the following recommendations, rules, and directions for a self-guided tour of Lot 10:

- <u>A 4 wheel drive vehicle is recommended</u>. If you have a 2 wheel drive vehicle, and want to drive up the gravel road, we suggest you put the vehicle in a low gear and make sure you have adequate ground clearance.
- Be careful when meeting oncoming vehicles: there is enough room, in general, to pass at very slow speeds and with care.
- Along the road there are occasional areas adequate for turnaround, as well as a well marked area with ample turnaround space at the end of the gravel road.
- Please don't take your vehicle off the gravel road, but you may walk on the grass roads.
- Be careful not to leave Stagebridge property.
- If you do not have a suitable vehicle, or in the case of inclement weather, walk the tour rather than drive. Stagebridge is not responsible for vehicle damage, injury, or other loss.



## **DIRECTIONS:**

- -The White Tail Branch Road tour begins along Stagebridge Trail. You will begin by driving on White Tail Branch Road on lot 9, where you will drive past Settler's Rest.
- -Settler's Rest is a cemetery located on Stagebridge Trail. This is a private family cemetery that dates back into the 1800s. Feel free to stop and look about.
- -After Settler's Rest. White Tail Branch Road curves and enters lot 10.
- -White Tail Branch Road ends just past the border of lot 9 and 10, where separate private driveways for each lot begin.
- -Make a left hand turn and enter lot 10 via the ford.
- -Here you will also see the Stagebridge Community walking path along the right side of White Tail Branch stream as it winds through lots 9 and 10.
- -In addition, there is a private walking path on lot 10. It is on the left just past the ford, along the southeast side of White Tail Branch.
- -On your drive up lot 10's driveway, be sure to stop and look at the cleared area (a potential home site), perfect for horses, vineyard, or any hobby you desire, then proceed up to the 2<sup>nd</sup> potential house site for lot 10 and a turnaround area where you can park.
- -Going downhill from lot 10's housesite is the walking trail to Poplar Springs a delightful bowl full of Poplar trees where a spring indicates the head of "Poplar Springs Stream." Look for a grass road with a rope across.
- -You may walk up the hill toward Lot 9, as well. Lot 9 is private property and is not included in this tour.

- -Once you are finished with your tour of lot 10, proceed carefully back to your vehicle and be sure to turn around in the designated turn around location.
- We hope you have enjoyed your tour of Lot 10, please come again!
